



Bunting to celebrate Yateley School's 50th birthday

We are offering the community the opportunity to take part in making bunting for the school to use at celebratory events.

- Yateley School students and staff are invited to make one pennant each
- Yateley's primary and junior schools' Year 6 pupils are invited to make one pennant each
- Yateley community groups are invited to make up to four pennants per group

Please keep to the following instructions for making your pennant:

The pennants

- must be made of fabric (no paper or other materials)
- may only be in navy blue, red or white or patterns with any combination of just those three colours
- must be an isosceles triangle (two equal sides) with a base and height of 25cm (10"). The triangle base – 25cm (10") - will form the top of the pennant as it hangs down from a tape.



If you wish your pennant to have a little extra, such as your initials, or something in memory of someone, this may not take up more than half of the pennant and must only be in fabric (appliqué) or using waterproof fabric pens. No pen or biro markings please. If you do this, please be mindful that the pennants will be seen from both sides. And please NO 'stick-ons' such as flowers, ribbons, glitter etc.

We would be delighted if community groups wished to include their emblem or logo on their pennants.

If you have sewing skills:

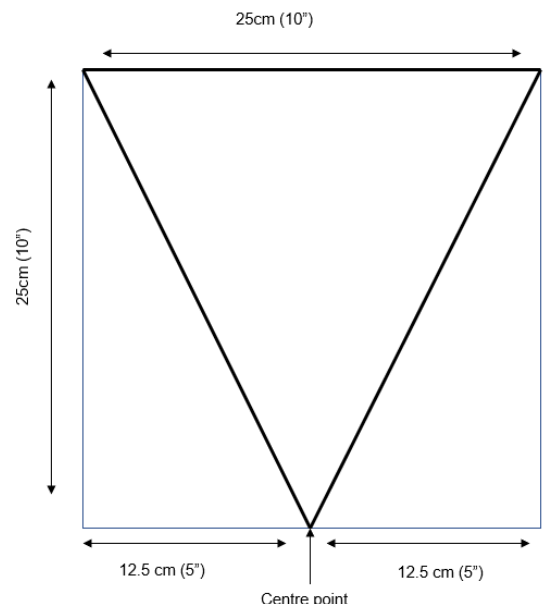
- Cut two triangles of fabric
- With right sides together stitch along the two longer sides 1cm or ¼" from the edge
- Snip excess material from the point at the bottom
- Turn the inside to the outside and press
- Leave the top edge as a raw, but neat, edge

No sewing skills?

- Use felt or reversible fabric (not too flimsy)
- Finish the edges on the long sides with pinking shears

How to make a paper template for an isosceles triangle

- Draw a square 25 cm (10") x 25 cm (10")
- On one side, mark the centre point
- Draw two straight lines from the opposite corners down to the centre point.
- Cut out your isosceles triangle
